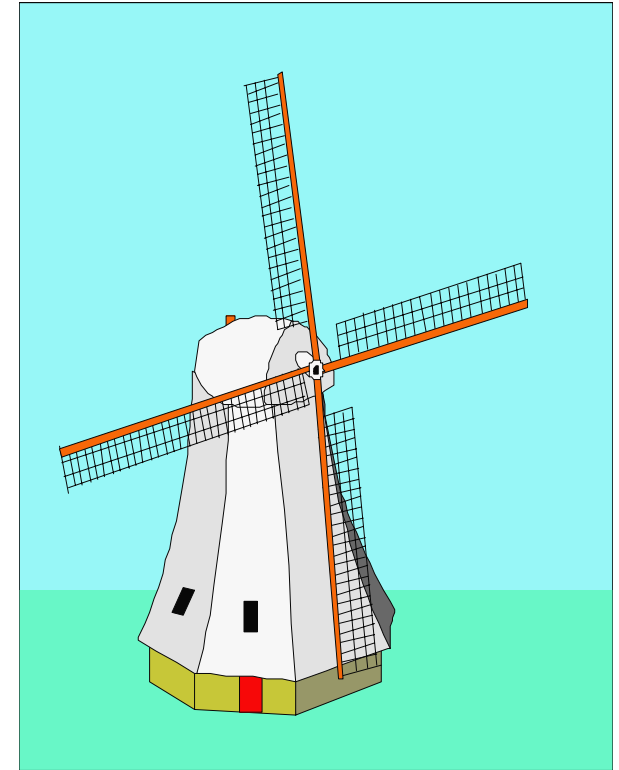


The BACF does not generally fund

- Endowment or annual campaigns
- Debt retirement or deficit financing
- Direct support of individuals
- Individual or group travel
- Political organizations or campaigns
- Sectarian causes
- Routine operating expenses

After review of all applications, the Board, at its sole discretion, will make the final determination of grants based upon funding availability and the impact of the project and/or organization on the community. All applicants will be notified of the status of their application following the Board decision.

## What is a Community Foundation?

A community foundation is a tax exempt, non-profit autonomous publicly supported institution organized and operated primarily as a permanent collection of endowed funds for the long term benefit of a defined geographic area.

The Baldwin Area Community Foundation (BACF) was established to stimulate and facilitate the current and future needs of the Baldwin area by attracting, managing and distributing charitable contributions.

Established in 1991, the BACF is a relatively young Foundation. As such, current annual distributions from the Foundation are limited and will grow as the assets of the Foundation increase.

The BACF Board is comprised of volunteers from throughout the community.

## Funding Priorities

Grants applications are considered on the basis of how well they help the BACF fulfill its mission within the Baldwin community.

The BACF looks favorably upon projects especially within the areas of health care, welfare, education, recreation and the arts

- that respond to overall community needs and priorities.
- that do not duplicate existing services.
- that make a meaningful difference in meeting a need in the community.
- that build upon the strengths of our community.
- that meet the charitable needs of an emergency.
- that fulfill unmet needs within the community.

## Other Funds

Additional funding awards may be provided through Donor Designated funds. Because the use of these funds is designated by the donor, these awards are made outside the realm of the general grant application process.

The Baldwin Area Community Foundation provides an annual educational scholarship to a graduating Baldwin-Woodville High School senior. Graduating seniors may contact the BACF for a scholarship application.

## Who May Apply

The Baldwin Area Community Foundation will consider grant applications from units of government, the Baldwin-Woodville School District, and 501(c)(3) nonprofits organizations that benefits the Baldwin community.

## Application Deadline

The Baldwin Area Community Foundation reviews general grant applications once per year.
